



Supplementary Fig. S1- Biomass of earthworms in the field before and after the spreading of organic products. Error bars indicate one standard error. Considering the two dates together, the date significantly influenced total and adult earthworm biomass (Scheirer-Ray-Hare tests, p-values < 0.05). A) Long-term effect of repeated organic product applications: first sampling date, in plots differentiated for 2 years, 7 days before spreading. Adult and total biomasses were not found impacted by treatment (Kruskal-Wallis test, p-value > 0.05). B) Second sampling date, 14 days after spreading. Comparison with subfigure 1.A show the impact of fertilization after 2 weeks on soil earthworm populations. Adult and total biomasses were not found impacted by treatment (Kruskal-Wallis test, p-value > 0.05).
